About us.

MSLACA is a not-for-profit organization founded March 28th, 1977, in Overland, Missouri. The Metropolitan St. Louis Association for Court Administration (MSLACA) was created for area court administrators to share information and obtain educational training specific to the administration of municipal divisions.

The association is led by an Executive Board consisting of elected and appointed persons that are governed by a set of bylaws adopted solely by the membership.

MSLACA is a member driven organization fueled by member participation. Throughout the year there are multiple opportunities to volunteer to host meetings, trainings, present educational topics, plan association outings, and volunteer in the communities in which we serve.

Membership is inclusive of all who are engaged in a field related to court management.

Our Purpose.

The purpose of this association shall be to define, educate, and achieve the art & science of court administration through:

- Promoting and developing the association as an agency for the professional benefit of court administrators and/or other officials or persons with the same or similar powers and duties.
- Promoting a better understanding by the court administrator of his or her official duties, obligations, and responsibilities.
- Establishing and improving methods and procedures in record keeping in the field of court administration.
- Promoting cooperation and assistance between member and non-member court administrators.
- Urging association members to be active participants in the association and performing services that may best meet the interest and needs of the association and the public we serve as court personnel.

Membership.

There are three membership classifications:

Active- Any person serving as a clerk of the court, court administrator, or other recognized title or assistant to the administrative title, may become an active member upon the payment of dues. Active Members may vote, hold office and serve on committees, and are eligible to apply for a scholarship to attend the MACA Annual Conference. All Active Members are expected to attend a minimum of fifty percent (50%) of regular membership meetings held each year.

Associate- Any person engaged in a field related to the work of the court and its administration, may become an Associate Member upon the payment of dues. A member of the judicial system and/or prosecutor's clerk role would be in this membership classification. Associate members may vote, hold office, and serve on committees. All Associate Members are expected to attend a minimum of fifty percent (50%) of regular membership meetings held each year.

Retired- Reserved for active members upon retirement from the judicial system. Retired members may serve on committees and may vote but may not hold office.
